Description

This course is open to students who demonstrate approximately advanced reading comprehension skills and a refined knowledge of sentence structure and the Arabic verb system. They can compose essays using the whole tenses (past, present, and future) and syntactic structures, and comprehend a variety of authentic Arabic materials within a normal range of speed. They understand the general ideas of news broadcasts intended for native speakers. Jordanian dialect course hours are front-loaded to build a foundation of communicative competency upon students' arrival in Amman. After the first week, course hours taper to an average of 5 hours per week.

The dialects of the Arabic language differ greatly from one another, even within dialect groups that have much in common like the Levantine dialects originating from Lebanon, Syria, Palestine and Jordan. Within the context of Amman, advanced speakers of Arabic require communicative proficiency in not only Jordanian Arabic, but also in the other Levantine dialects to interact with the diverse populations present in the city.

The course relies on MSA as the shared source for regional dialects and expands upon student knowledge through television, media, and social media from throughout the region of the Levant. The class also presents literature written in Levantine dialect and shines a light on several contemporary Arab bands that have dealt with taboos within society, politics and religion through their music, which is performed in their dialects. This course examines popular and religious expressions and proverbs, and places them in their religious, political, and economic contexts to build a deep understanding of the way the Levantine dialects have developed. Special attention is given to cultural and social themes which demonstrate the diversity of local perspectives and highlight the power dynamics that help shape them. The course handles some explicit or derogatory vocabulary with sensitivity to map the movement of ideas into language and cultural practice through a sociolinguistic lens.

Objectives



Upon successful completion, students can:

- Discern differences and similarities between Jordanian and neighboring dialects
- Incorporate cultural references, pertinent vernaculars, idioms, socio-cultural expressions and proverbs from varying Levantine sub-dialects
- Understand salient aspects of regional culture through television programming from Syria, Lebanon, and Jordan
- Examine regional art, popular culture, and religious beliefs in context and extrapolate new vocabulary and build a linguistic understanding of how dialects develop and affect one another
- Comprehend speakers of Levantine sub-dialects in simple contexts

Course Requirements

The pace of instruction is intensive. Students are expected to thoroughly prepare for each class and to actively participate. In-class activities and homework may include listening to songs, watching TV programs, watching or reading plays, and giving impromptu oral presentations. Projects assigned throughout the term require students to synthesize information learned in class materials with their own research and interviews conducted with roommates, language partners and other locals, and present their findings to their classmates. With the help of their academic partners, students take turns leading a class session, dissecting an episode, song or proverb, and facilitating class discussion and analysis. Some assignments offer students the opportunity to engage in discussion with Jordanians via social media.

All homework assignments are due at the beginning of class and late assignments are not accepted. Quizzes and pop quizzes are administered throughout the term. Each month, students prepare a project connecting to the subjects and learning objectives covered that month. During the final week, students undergo an oral interview exam covering the depth and breadth of material covered throughout the semester. Individual interviews last approximately 15 minutes. Each student is required to present as a recording an original skit, individually or in a group, during the final week of classes. Vocabulary used in the skit is drawn from vocabulary previously covered in class.

Class attendance, as outlined in the CET Attendance Policy, is critical for success in the course, as is learning how to engage and navigate Jordan's cultural environment. In addition to time in class, students should expect to spend a minimum of one hour studying for every hour spent in the classroom. Field-based excursions, for which attendance is required, may include a cooking activity, café activity, and farm activity.

Grading

Students are evaluated on the four skills (reading, writing, speaking, and listening) through quizzes, skits, written and oral exams and class participation.

The final grade is determined as follows:

Homework: 20%

Outline of Course Content

During the semester, approximately two weeks are dedicated to each topic. In the summer term, topics are covered in one week at an accelerated pace.
